

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LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear ESRS and ANSS members, Dear Colleagues and Friends,

One year ago at this same period, I was telling you that if the few months following our traditional ESRS congress were once upon a time a quiet period, the content of the March 2013 newsletter's edition clearly demonstrated how the ESRS teams are working hard to the benefit of our society. Approaching now the 2014 edition of our biannual congress, I am sure that this March 2014 edition will convince you even more that we are working harder than ever, not only to make the Tallinn meeting a big success, but also to make your sleep society worth your confidence by improving its actions and efficiency!

But first of all, let us welcome our 38 newly accepted members, listed at the end of this newsletter. Many thanks for joining us in the ESRS community! You will soon be joined by the more than 80 sleep scientists who also recently applied for ESRS membership. As explained previously, applicants' names are published in the members-restricted section of the ESRS website (please login to view the list at <u>www.esrs.eu/membership-services/applicants-list.html</u>), and they will become automatically ESRS members two months after publication unless an objection is raised by ESRS members.

It is also a renewed pleasure to congratulate the recipients of the ESRS Travel Grants 2014 (to view their names click <u>here</u>), a continued initiative of the ESRS Research Networking Committee (RNC). We have received many candidatures this year, demonstrating the success of the operation. The RNC and the Scientific Committee (SC) have closely collaborated to select the successful recipients amongst a series of excellent applications, and our only regret is not having been able to support more of them. Besides, the RNC continues working hard to develop opportunities to promote sleep research and interactions between sleep researchers in Europe. In this respect, I am especially pleased to announce the launch of an ESRS Young Researchers Network in Tallinn, a novel initiative coordinated by the RNC and our Icelandic member Erna Sif Arnardottir.

Preparations are now accelerating for our next ESRS meeting to be held in Tallinn, September 16-20th. It is now the right time to start submitting your best studies as the **deadline for abstract submission is April 23th**. As usual, the Scientific Committee will review and rate all abstracts for the oral and poster communication sessions, which will be published in a supplement of the Journal of Sleep Research. And if you are still a young scientist, you have a chance to see your work selected for presentation in the opening session of the congress during our prestigious Young Scientist Symposium, so do not hesitate to apply! Importantly, we have also decided to give a quick review to the poster sessions, which will now be held at the end of the day after the oral sessions. This will avoid any concurrent activities and make for a good preparation for lively discussions over dinner in the evening. I can also promise some nice surprises to make these poster sessions a truly pleasant and fruitful moment for scientific interactions!

To further stimulate your appetite, the scientific program of the congress is now available on the congress website (<u>www.esrs-congress.eu/esrs2014/scientific-programme.html</u>). I am very proud to tell that we have an excellent and well-balanced selection of symposia, thanks to the work of the Scientific and Organizing Committees, and four outstanding and stimulating Keynote speakers with Professors Richard Morris, Allison Harvey, Jim Krueger and Jan Hedner. Also, do not forget our Teaching courses on September 16th, which will cover a wide variety of clinical and basic domains including updates on sleep medicine, pharmacology of the sleep-wake cycle and drug development, CBT-I across the life span, circadian and homeostatic regulation of sleep, and the spectrum of current therapies in sleep disordered breathing.

And finally, Tallinn will witness the organization of the first regular examination for European somnologists. This examination is directed to physicians, psychologists and scientists who are willing to receive the ESRS European certification in sleep medicine. Furthermore, we are organizing the first grandparents' certification in sleep medicine for sleep technologists, in cooperation with the European Sleep Technologist Association. Like the 122 sleep specialists who have obtained the ESRS grandfather certification in sleep medicine, these grandparent sleep technologists are expected to take the lead in the development of sleep medicine technology in Europe, and we are looking forward to welcome them. For those two examinations, be aware that the **deadline for submitting your application is April 3rd**, so take your chance now!

Hence, there are many reasons for you to come to Tallinn and be part of the best meeting to hear about the last advances and share experiences in sleep research and sleep medicine in a friendly atmosphere. And in the meantime, you are also welcome to join us July 4th in Milan for the ESRS satellite meeting "Understanding Sleep: Novel Perspectives in Neurosciences", organized at the 9th FENS Forum of Neuroscience (click <u>here</u>).

You will find also in this newsletter updates about the other meetings organized by the ESRS, and of course about the numerous activities conducted by the ESRS Committees and networks.

I wish you a pleasant reading of this 2013 March newsletter. Sleep well and live well, we are looking forward to seeing you soon!

ESRS Research Networking Committee (RNC)

The RNC continues to facilitate the Networking of Sleep Researchers. On 13th December, 2013 the Co-ordinators of the European Networks (Forum for Women in Sleep Research; EIN; EU-NN; ESADA) were asked to circulate a letter encouraging their members to become ESRS members as well register their Laboratory in our <u>European Sleep Research Database</u>. As a result of these efforts, we currently have 94 Laboratories registered, with another 19 Laboratories pending approval. Unapproved submissions are partly incomplete and submitters are kindly asked to check the completeness of their application (for submission guidelines, click <u>here</u>.)

The annual ESRS Travel Grant scheme (2014) for young researchers has been completed. We received a wide range of applications with candidates from across Europe. Simon Archer, Pierre-Hervé Luppi and I had a difficult task selecting 10 awardees. These trainees and the Laboratories that will host them are detailed <u>here</u>.

I am also pleased to announce that Erna Sif Arnardottir (Iceland) has agreed to assist in co-ordinating the launch of the ESRS Young Researchers Network. A special session for Young Researchers will be held at the forthcoming ESRS Congress in Tallinn (Friday 19th September 2014, 12.30-14.00). Please spread the word about this exciting initiative!

The Sleep Medicine Committee is working towards the next examinations which will take place at the beginning of the next ESRS congress 2014 in Tallinn, on 16th September 2014. Currently ESRS members can submit their applications. The deadline for submission is 3rd April 2014.

The examinations will be for physician, psychologist, scientist a regular exam, and a grandparents examination for sleep technologists in cooperation with the European Sleep Technologist Association. We are looking forward to a great attendance and are currently preparing the questions and the suggested reading material. The suggested reading material will be announced to all applicants shortly after the deadline for submissions.

The <u>Catalogue of knowledge and skills for sleep medicine</u>, first published online as Early View article, has now appeared as final-published article in the April 2014 issue of the <u>Journal of Sleep Research</u>. The catalogue is the basis for sleep medicine education courses and for a textbook covering all aspects of sleep medicine required to pass the examination successfully. The Sleep Medicine Committee is working on the update of the sleep centre accreditation publication together with the European Respiratory Society (ERS). The update will include technical issues and propose different types of sleep centres (training centres, comprehensive centres, specialized centres) currently discussed in Europe. The alignment with the ERS, more specifically the HERMES program for respiratory sleep medicine is continued. A new meeting with ESRS and ERS delegates is planned for spring this year.

ESRS EU Committee

December 2013 – March 2014

The main aims of the Committee are: i) to bring the topics of "sleep" and "sleep disorders" to the attention of the EU in order to receive support for research and teaching activities; ii) to promote sleep-related issues from a political point of view at a European and National level.

Following the big achievements of 2013 (Wake-up bus project, Meeting at the EU Parliament in Brussels, Meeting "Networking to Understand Sleep Functions and Dysfunctions -The European Basic and Clinical Sleep Research Towards Horizon 2020", within the EU "Month of the Brain" program) the organization and duties of the Committee are under revision in order to make a further step forward in the relationship between the ESRS and the EU.

According to this, the possibility to enlarge the Committee, giving to every member a precise responsibility in strengthening the relationship between the different ESRS Committees and the four major pillars of interest for ESRS within the EU (i.e. Health, Research, Education, and Road Safety) will be discussed in the next ESRS Board meeting. Furthermore, new modalities of interaction between the EU Committee and the National Sleep Societies will be proposed during the forthcoming ANSS meeting in order to better homogenize and synchronize the efforts aimed at increasing the visibility of sleep research and sleep medicine in Europe.

REPORTS OF THE EUROPEAN NETWORKS

European Insomnia Network (EIN)

Already in 2013, the European Insomnia Network had applied for funding with the socalled EU Cost Action. Cost actions do not serve to directly fund research work, but they are aimed at supporting networking between researchers and clinicians Europewide. Furthermore, they serve to support young researchers to seek exchanges between laboratories across Europe. Unfortunately, our first application did not make it to the second round, i.e. it was rejected. Based on this experience and on advice from the German national contact point, the European Insomnia Network now has submitted a revised and strongly improved application for the Cost Action Programme in 2014. First decisions will be published in May, so we are looking forward and expecting the best.

Furthermore, the European Insomnia Network will be present at the Tallinn Meeting on the one hand with a symposium reflecting some of its work presented by young speakers from various European countries. Furthermore, a case seminar on therapy refractory insomnia will be held.

European Narcolepsy Network (EU-NN)



The 5th European Narcolepsy Day (END) was held in Copenhagen, March 14-16, chaired by Dr. Prof. P. Jennum (see <u>welcomehome.dk/ENN-2014/HOME.aspx</u>). The EU-NN annual assembly was held the day before, on

March 14th. An audience of around 100 people from Europe followed the scientific meeting. The speakers presented state of the art presentation and/or hot topics

concerning pathogenesis: genetics and autoimmunity; autonomic functions; neurobiology of REM sleep and cataplexy; comorbidities and treatment. The Day of the Patient was another feature of the meeting. Patients met with representatives from various European countries. A new website was presented.

The 2014 winner of the EU-NN Young Investigators Award was Dr. Armand Mensen with the article entitled "Humour as a Reward Mechanism: Event-Related Potentials in the Healthy and Diseased Brain", *A Mensen, R Poryazova, S Schwartz, R Khatami,* Plos One, 2014.

During the EU-NN Assembly two board members stepped down: M Tafti and R Khatami. G Mayer, GJ Lammers and R Riha were (re)elected as members of the Board.

R Peraita-Adrados and M Partinen will remain for one additional year. The Assembly participants elected G. Mayer as the new president of the EU-NN.

EU-NN 2014 grants for young scientists and for senior investigators were selected for five applicants for collaborative projects (1-2 months) within different sleep centres in Europe.

More than 680 new cases have been entered in the EU-NN database in 2012-2014. Data quality algorithms classify as validated cases according to EU-NN predefined standards. These data qualify for further prospective studies. The design of the children DB is finished and it will be available at the end of the 2nd quarter. We thank the contributing centres for their effort.

As of 1st March 2014, 27 full members of 28 centres from 14 different European countries join the EU-NN. Besides the publication on the retrospective database, there have been two other recent publications on behalf of the EU-NN.

The European Network Session - European Narcolepsy Network is scheduled on: Wednesday, 17 September 2014, 17.00-18.30 in Tallinn (Estonia).

The European Sleep Apnea Database (ESADA)



- a progress report for the ESRS newsletter

News from the ESADA sleep apnea network

The European Sleep Apnea Database – ESADA – was started in 2006 as a collaborative database effort between more than 27 European sleep centres. During 2013 the new centre in Hamburg, Germany (Dr. Holger Hein) has been included into the network (centre no 27). By March 20 2014, 15 956 patients have been enrolled into the database and data from 5 313 follow up visits are available.

The annual ESADA network meeting 2013 was hosted by Renata Riha and her team in Edinburgh, UK, on 19-20th of April 2013 and for 2014 the meeting will take place between March 27 and March 30 in Mandranova, Sicily, Italy, with Marisa Bonsignore as our host.

During the last year major achievements have been reached:

- 1. Recruitment of new patients is ongoing and proportionally more follow up visits are registered.
- 2. Publication of results from the ESADA are soon available to the public:

REPORT OF THE ASSEMBLY OF NATIONAL SLEEP SOCIETIES (ANSS) November 2013 to March 2014

The EC of the ANSS has met in Valencia (March 2014) and had frequent contacts via e-mail and telephone conferences (December 2013 and February 2014). The activities can be summarized as follows:

Our main activity is the ongoing preparation for the Annual ANNS meeting in Graz, Austria, together with the ESRS board and relevant ESRS committees. All presidents or representatives of the National Sleep Societies - please register for the meeting on Friday the 2nd of May until Sunday the 4th of May 2014 and inform Stefan Mihaicuta (stefan.mihaicuta@umft.ro) and Wolfgang Mallin (mallinw@aon.at). The detailed programme will be available on the ESRS website.

Our second focus is on the finalization of several status reports regarding education, certification and reimbursement of sleep medicine services in Europe. For the reimbursement project we have involved a health economist at the University of Stavanger, Norway. This work is in progress and we plan to present the most recent data at the ANSS Graz meeting in May 2014.

Further activities: The sleep study results are presented at meeting and a manuscript is under preparation (MG). The Wake Up Bus Project and the structure and achievements of the ANSS within the ESRS were presented at the regional meeting of 12 Eastern and Central European countries in Belgrade (February 2014, LG). The update of the ANSS information on the ESRS webpage with regard to the ANSS has been further processed (MDG, JP). The major developments will be presented on the website.

New ANSS member: Slovakia has been accepted as a member of the ANSS and we welcome the Sleep Society of Slovakia with its president Professor Imrich Mucska!

Register now for Examinations in Tallinn

Registration for the two upcoming examinations for certification in sleep medicine closes **on 3 April, 2014**. Do not delay, apply online now.

The 3rd Examination of the Certification in Sleep Medicine:

Tuesday, 16 September 2014 at 17:30 – 18:45 at the ESRS Congress in Tallinn

The examination will be a written test consisting of 50 multiple-choice questions to be completed on-site. Cut-off for successfully passing the examination is 50% correct answers.

Doctors, Physicians, and Psychologists that wish to take the examination must be current members of the ESRS and should have a minimum level of experience in sleep medicine as outlined in the <u>application announcement</u>.

The 1st Examination of the Certification in Sleep Medicine for Sleep Technologists:

Tuesday, 16 September, 17:30 – 18:45 and Wednesday, 17 September, 17:00 – 20:00 at the ESRS/ESST Congress in Tallinn

This will be the first technologist examination directed exclusively at "grandfathers" and "grandmothers". "Grandparenting" is a procedure which applies to professionals with wide experience in sleep technology, medicine and research. It is envisioned by the ESRS that the "grandparents" in this context may take the lead in future European and National activities to promote sleep medicine professionals.

The examination will consist of two components. The first part will be a written test consisting of 50 multiple-choice questions to be completed on-site. A suggested reading list will be provided. Cut-off for successfully passing this part of the examination is 50% correct answers. The second part of the examination will focus

on practical skills. This part will involve sleep staging, event scoring and interpreting 2 excerpts from PSG recordings and also a full MSLT recording. Both parts must be successfully passed in order to qualify for certification.

Technologists, nurses, and other sleep professionals that wish to take the examination must be current members of the ESRS and should meet the application criteria as specified on the <u>application announcement</u>.
